

ABSTRACT SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Abstract **must be submitted** by the registered person who will give the presentation at the symposium and will be considered as main author. Authors may submit multiple abstracts for consideration.

The **number of presentations** made by an author **is limited to two** (1 oral and 1 poster), although he/she may be listed as a co-author on any number of submitted abstracts.

All presenting authors (for oral or poster presentations) are required to register **before 15th October 2020**.

- **Two** types of presentations are possible:
 - Oral (10 min presentation on stage followed by 5 min questions).
 - Poster presentations.

The abstracts must include:

1. Title (max 100 characters)
2. The name(s) of author(s)
3. Any affiliations (i.e. to an organisation)
4. The selected theme
5. The email of the corresponding author
6. Keywords (max. 5 words)
7. A main body of text (max. 300 words).

Abstracts should be structured in such a way as to include:

1. Purpose/objective
2. Material/methods
3. Results
4. Conclusions.

Figures, tables, equations, undefined acronyms, or reference citations cannot be part of the abstract.

Abstracts should be clear and concise and shall be written in British English. For non-native speakers we advise to have the abstract checked by a native speaker. Points (.) should be adopted as decimal marks and commas (,) as thousand separators.

The information provided in the abstract will be included in the Conference programme and publications of abstracts in the form they were submitted. Please use proper capitalisation throughout your abstract submission (for names and affiliations as well as in the main body of text), and refrain from using all capital letters.

Abstracts submitted for presentation will be peer-reviewed by the international panel of members of the Scientific Committee. Abstract review criteria are based on clarity, supporting data, scientific rigour, relevance, wide range applicability and innovation.
